Additionally, we'd like to welcome Mike Darrow, who was appointed to the ILE utility board last week. Mike brings extensive experience in water and municipality management.

We are happy to announce that one of the playground shades has been installed and two more are on the way, which should bring some relief and much-needed shade to the playground area.

A friendly reminder-if you don't have a gate key card, I encourage you to pick one up in the office. They are \$15.

Obviously you can utilize the call box to let yourself or have someone let you in, but it's good to have a back up.

This past weekend a relatively new resident wasn't able to get someone over the phone and lifted the gate manually to gain access and with that caused over \$1600 in damages. They did come forward, which is admirable, however they are charged with the cost of the repair now.

We had pretty close to \$400,000 budgeted for paving, we received bids and the paving will commence at the end of August/beginning of September. We targeted the roads that were in very bad shape and had the highest density of homes.

The county has ramped up code enforcement in our community. If you are unsure of the code violations, please reach out to the office and we can provide you direct from the county what is enforceable. I know several notices of violation have been issued in the last several weeks. Let's all do our part to keep our amazing community looking its best.

Frank and Andy and the restaurant staff have done an amazing job in a consistent experience in the restaurant to include food and service. The expenses for the restaurant are down versus a year ago, which is pretty impressive given the cost of goods has increased over the last year.

Julie and Rebecca and the social committee have many events planned throughout the rest of the year and into next year. Some are regular events and some are very unique and fun. Check out the calendar on our website for all the events happening in our community monthly.

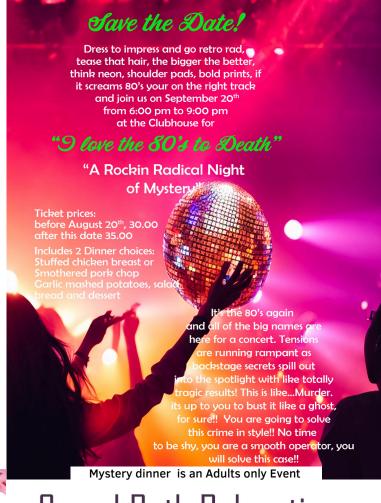
To our ILEU customers:
